Course Description: This scenario-based course provides law enforcement personnel with the skills to interact with the Russian-speaking community to deter, interdict, and counteract drug-related activity. Students will not only be provided with a foundational basis of the Russian language upon which to build for future use, but will also leave the course with a greater understanding of Russian-speaking culture and societal norms. These skills coupled with practical scenarios involving drug-related traffic stops, smuggling interdictions, and organized crime syndicate analysis will provide the student with a Russian language survival guide for law enforcement operations.

Course Length: 8 hours
