Course Description:

This 8 hour course is designed to introduce attendees to an overview of AB 109 & Proposition 47 and the effects they both have had on the county jail system and the influx of gang members. This course will discuss current trends and the influence that high ranking Sureño gang members have had on the more heavily populated jails within county jail environments due to the California Realignment Sentencing Reform (PC 1170h). This course will discuss the currents trends and methods that inmates are currently using to smuggle illegal narcotics and contraband into jail facilities and throughout the corrections systems. This course will also discuss case law, how to document your case, how to protect sources of information, and ways to educate your local district attorneys as it relates to gang activity within your county correctional system.

Instructor:

Detective Armando Castillo Jr. is a 26 veteran of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Department. He has spent the last six years supervising the Centralized Classification Unit (CCU) that oversees the Corrections Bureau classification of inmates, population management, and gathers gang intelligence. He has worked many high profile cases on several major narcotics teams, Specialized Investigations-Homicide Unit, and Corrections Bureau. Armando has taken hundreds of hours of job specific training in the field of informant handling, gang, narcotic, homicide, and wire tap investigations. He assisted with the creation of CCU and is the primary instructor for the Classification course that covers the identification of gang
