**Class Description:** With the passage of Proposition 64 and the legalization of Recreational Cannabis, there has been a marked increase in Cannabis related DUI's, traffic collisions and other related offenses. The predictions for the future are that Cannabis use will continue to increase and traffic safety will decrease significantly. In this course you will learn the life cycle of the Cannabis plant, a basic understanding of cultivation methods, useable forms of Cannabis, associated paraphernalia and necessary terminology. Specific areas to be covered are:

- Long Term and Short-Term Effects of Cannabis
- Identifying Chronic Users
- THC vs. CBD
- Understanding the difference between Recreational and Medical Cannabis
- Cannabis DUI specific pre-FST questioning
- Use and understanding of SFST's to identify Cannabis Impairment
- Report Writing and Courtroom Issues
- Search and Seizure and other legal issues
- Cannabis Metabolism in the Human Body
- The "Per Se Limit" confusion
- Scientific Studies relating to Cannabis and Cannabis DUI

At the conclusion of the class you will have a better understanding of how Cannabis effects the Human Body and have the necessary tools to evaluate someone you suspect of being under the influence of Cannabis. As well as be able to present a prosecutable case and testify in court.

#### **Instructors:**

**Bill MacDonald:** Deputy Sheriff with the Napa Co. Sheriff's Office assigned to Patrol. Bill has been in law enforcement for over 24 years, is a DRE and a former Narcotics and Major Crimes Detective. He has developed training for new DUI prosecutors, this specific course and a similar training course he teaches out of state. Also provides expert testimony in drug influence and other drug related matters.

**Dave Mustard:** Deputy Sheriff with the Napa Co. Sheriff's Office, assigned to the City of American Canyon as a Motor Officer. He has 29 years of experience as an Officer in Davis, Vallejo and currently at Napa SO. Dave has worked as a Police Officer, Narcotics Detective and Narcotics Supervisor, a DAR and SFST Instructor as well and an expert witness for drug influence and other drug related offenses.
