### **“Wiretap Investigations and Prosecutions”**

#### **Course Description:**

This one-day course explains the legal and investigative issues surrounding a wiretap. Students will be introduced to the initial process of preparing a wiretap affidavit, including both the legal requirements for seeking a wiretap and the practical investigative questions that must be addressed prior to obtaining judicial approval for a wiretap. The course will also explain the various issues that often occur during the course of a wiretap, as well as what steps must be taken at the close of the wiretap investigation to prepare the case for prosecution.

#### **Instructors:**

Patrick Vanier is currently the lead deputy district attorney for the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office assigned to the Santa Clara County Human Exploitation and Trafficking Task Force. Mr. Vanier has been a prosecutor working in two Bay Area counties for almost twenty years. In 2006, Mr. Vanier arrived in Santa Clara County where he has served on the Sexual Assault Team and the Narcotics Prosecution Team. For the past five years Mr. Vanier was the Supervising Deputy District Attorney for the Narcotics Prosecution Team. Mr. Vanier has spent more than half of his career working with law enforcement agencies investigating and prosecuting major narcotics cases with a particular emphasis on Mexican National drug cartels, organized crime, and gangs operating within California. Mr. Vanier's area of expertise is in the area of wiretap investigations. He has reviewed more than 100 wiretap applications and prosecuted dozens of wiretap cases.

Satish Jallepalli has been a deputy district attorney for nearly 17 years. During that time his primary assignments have been in Narcotics and Gangs. He has worked on wiretap investigations, primarily involving Richmond gangs, and has taught courses for CDAA on wiretaps. He works closely with law enforcement and line deputy prosecutors to coordinate the office's transition into the ECPA's requirements.
